ASSEMBLY BILL 1826

COMMERCIAL SURVEY

In September 2014, the Governor approved Assembly Bill No. 1826 (AB 1826) – an Organics Recycling bill. This bill defines organics as:

Food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste.

AB 1826 is meant to divert organics, as defined above, from landfills in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and environmental impacts. Organics will now be used for composting and/or the creation of energy/fuel by an anaerobic digestion company.

AB 1826 mandates that all businesses recycle organics by:

- Subscribing to an organics recycling company services (Peña's Disposal).
- Donate or sell organics for recycling.
